1. GENERAL

1.01 This section has been issued to provide a description of the B Canvas Tray and to list its uses.

1.02 The B tray presently available is a modification of an earlier version of the B tray which did not have pockets.

2. DESCRIPTION




Fig. 1 – B Canvas Tray

2.01 The B Canvas Tray is a collapsible, rectangularly shaped tray made of medium weight green cotton duck with a covered Masonite floor. It has two 5-inch wide pockets on one side and one 10-inch pocket on the opposite side. The pockets are sewn onto the outside of the tray. The B Canvas Tray is shown in Fig. 1.

3. USE

3.01 The tray, when suspended from the strand,

is used for holding tools and materials. It may also be used to catch refuse from cable splicing operations.
