RECEIVERS, RECEIVER UNITS, AND RECEIVER HOLDERS SELECTION

1. GENERAL

- 1.01 This section is reissued to:
 - Change types of receiver units in Tables A, B, and C.
 - · Revise Table B.
- 1.02 The bone conductor receiver, used when the customer with impaired hearing requires transmission of sound through the bone, is described in Section 501-225-100.

2. SELECTION

2.01 Tables A and B show application information on receivers and receiver units used in station apparatus.

- **2.02** Table C shows the types of receiver holders and their uses.
- 2.03 The 717A receiver may be used as an auxiliary receiver to supplement the regular receiver on telephones installed at exceptionally noisy locations.
- 2.04 Auxiliary receivers should be connected to the same terminals as those normally used for receiver connections. Where more than three spade-tipped leads would be connected to a single screw terminal, two of the leads which would normally be connected to the terminal should be transferred to another terminal and be connected by a strap or M1W cord, if possible.
- 2.05 Auxiliary receivers and receiver holders should not be installed without a service order or other proper authorization.
