2.01 The K1A handset (Fig. 1) is of modular configuration designed for use with the applicable modular DESIGN LINE Telephone Sets.

Design Features

2.03 Standard handset circuit with T1 transmitter and LB-type receiver. Sealed handset is equipped with a receptacle type transmitter cup which receives the modular handset cord plug and may also be used with the 5A cord reel.

3. CONNECTIONS

3.01 Connect the K1A handset by plugging the handset cord into the handset jack and the other cord plug into the jack mounted in the telephone set base. Be sure the spring clips lock in place.

- 3.02 To replace the K1A handset, depress clip and pull plug of handset cord out of handset.




Fig. 2—K1A Handset, Internal Connections

- 3.03 Refer to Fig. 2 for internal connections of the handset.

4. MAINTENANCE
