#### TELEPHONE SERVICE INFORMATION:

General: The Atlantic and Pacific area military telephone system
is completely automatic or dial-operated. All Army-Air Force
telephone numbers consist of four digits, prefixed by the telephone
exchange identification number. Telephone exchange identification
numbers are as follows:

The Dialing Chart appearing on the inside front cover provides detailed information for use of exchange identification numbers. IT WILL BE NOTED THAT IN THE ATLANTIC AREAIT IS NECESSARY TO USE THE EXCHANGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (prefix 8-) FOR ALL FORT DAVIS & FORT GULICK TELEPHONE NUMBERS, AND THE EXCHANGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (prefix 6-) FOR ALL FORT SHERMAN TELEPHONE NUMBERS.

In the Pacific Area the exchange identification number is not used when placing intra-post calls.

Transisthmian Calls: To place a call from an ATLANTIC AREA telephone to a PACIFIC AREA telephone, and vice versa, DIAL "O", listen for the transisthmian dial tone, then dial the number as listed in the Directory (Identification Number and Telephone Number). TO DIAL A TELEPHONE NUMBER AT FORT SHERMAN FROM A PACIFIC AREA TELEPHONE, DIAL "O-8", THEN THE NUMBER AS LISTED IN THE DIRECTORY, EXAMPLE: DIAL 0-8-6-2111. FORT SHERMAN SUBSCRIBERS calling Fort Davis will dial the number as listed in the directory except that the first digit will be "7" instead of "8" as listed. EXAMPLE: LISTED NUMBER 8-7210 DIAL 7-7210.

Alternate Route Across The Isthmus: From any ARMY-AIR FORCE telephone DIAL 9-, then dial the Exchange Identification Number of the desired telephone exchange as given in the last vertical column of the DIALING CHART (inside front cover), then dial the subscriber's four digit telephone number.

Panama City-Automatic Exchange: Dial 9-28 or 82-9, then the desired number as listed in the Panama City Telephone Directory.

Colon--Manual Exchange: Dial 9-38, then give the answering operator the desired number.

#### 2. Application for Telephone Service:

- A. Official requests for new installations, moves, reassignments, etc., will be made in writing to the Signal Officer, USARCARIB, Corozal on the Pacific Side and to the Atlantic Telephone Operations Officer, Fort Davis, on the Atlantic Side, All requests will include the following information:
  - Building number, room number (if applicable) and exact location of desired telephone.
  - Exact telephone directory listing desired.
  - 3. Justification of work requested.
  - Approval of commanding officer or section chief concerned.
- B. Requests for unofficial (Class B) telephone service may be made by appearing in person at the Signal Office, Building 560, Corozal on the Pacific Side or the Signal Office, Fort Davis on the Atlantic Side, Each subscriber will be required to sign "Contract for Sale of Telephone Service", DA AGO Form 11-265 at time of application.
- 3. Charges for Class B Telephone Service: All Class B telephone subscribers are billed for service according to the calendar month, or portions thereof. This service is subdivided as follows:

After the 15th of each month, payments may be made only at the Signal Office, Corozal, C. Z. or the Telephone Exchange, Fort Davis, C.Z.

Non-receipt of a telephone bill is not considered to be an excuse for failure to pay telephone bills during prescribed period. Any bills for which payment is not in the hands of the collection agencies listed above by the close of business on the 15th will be declared delinquent. This does not mean in the mail or message center. This will apply regardless of the day of the week on which the 15th may fall. Service to all subscribers who are delinquent will be discontinued. Service will be re-established upon payment of delinquent bill and a \$2.00

reconnection charge.

#### 5. Long Distance Service:

A. Official long distance calls may be made from Class A telephones.

Authority to place an official long distance call must be obtained from designated officers as listed below:

Caribbean Command .... As prescribed by Chief of Staff U S Army Caribbean .... Chief of Staff Caribbean Air Command .. CAirC Reg 100-5 dated 9 Oct 52 & 5700th Air Base Group "Commercial Telephone Calls"

B. Unofficial long distance calls may be placed from Class B-1, B-1a, B-3 and B-4 telephones by dialing 82-2252 or 82-4250, Tropical Radio Telegraph Company. Information concerning rates may be obtained from the long distance operator at the above numbers. Charges for long distance calls made by Class B-1, B-1a, B-3 & B-4 subscribers will be added to the regular monthly telephone bill.

#### 6. Directory Service:

- A. Telephone directory service for all Army-Air Force installations is maintained by the Signal Officer, USARCARIB.
- B. It is the responsibility of all personnel to immediately notify the Directory Clerk, Telephone number 85-3121 of any changes in directory listing.

#### 7. Standards of Service:

- A. Telephone operators and installation personnel are instructed to be uniformly courteous and respectful. Reciprocal action on the part of all subscribers will definitely provide an incentive for superior service. In case of unsatisfactory service, the matter should be reported to the Installation Signal Officer, 85-2210 for Pacific Area, and Atlantic Telephone Operations Officer, 8-7210 for the Atlantic Area.
- B. All subscribers should make maximum utilization of the Telephone Directory to locate desired telephone numbers. If the desired party is not listed or cannot be located in the directory, dial the Information Operator, 114.

#### 8. Responsibilities of the Subscriber:

A. Telephones installed in quarters or offices are the responsibility of the individual concerned, with respect to proper care and use.

- 8. Responsibilities of the Subscriber -- Cont'd.
  - B. Not less than twenty-four (24) hours notice will be given the Signal Officer for discontinuance of service to quarters' subscribers.
  - C. All work incident to the installing, moving or removing of telephone equipment will be performed only by authorized Signal Corps personnel.
  - D. The painting of telephone instruments is not authorized.
  - E. Field Telephones and/or other attachments will not be connected to the telephone system.
